You couldn't have adapted any better. You set an exemplary example of how to navigate hard times. You showed up with passion, perseverance, compassion, and selflessness throughout the entire program. You embody the true meaning of GRIT, GRACE, and GRATITUDE! This is leadership!

Secondly, as you know, the past several months have been a time of unparalleled uncertainty, change, and challenge for all of us and it is normal to feel overwhelmed, out of sorts, and buried by our circumstances. However, don't let yourself get stuck there. I remember my childhood pastor, Wesley Brodin, telling the story of a farmer planting a seed. Did the farmer bury the seed or did he plant the seed? I encourage you to continue to look for the light at the end of the tunnel and to stay positive!

Thirdly, my mom was one of the most inspiring leaders I have known. She taught me firsthand the importance of hard work, being selfless, living life with passion, spreading optimism, telling the truth, being transparent, setting goals, and most importantly, never miss an opportunity to praise others. Always, say, "Thank you." These are two of the most important leadership words.

Lastly, I'll close with lines from one of my favorite quotes from Chuck Swindoll. "We are all faced with a series of great opportunities brilliantly disguised as impossible situations." And now the two most important leadership words: Thank YOU!
