Class of 2024

Jenna Stevens, Music Jam co-chair and 2021 LNWMO alum, presented the Leadership Northwest Missouri Citizenship Award for 2024 to Shane Lynch, Practice Manager, Wright Memorial Physicians' Group and Saint Lukes's Mercer County Clinic. Shane, with the help of LNWMO Class of 2021, created Music Jam which recently completed its fourth year.

Music Jam is LNWMO's top fundraiser, having raised over \$40,000 cumulatively while also boosting the local economy. This year the event established two scholarships for local high school seniors with a portion of the proceeds.

In Shane's professional role, he demonstrates exceptional leadership and volunteerism. Shane has a strong commitment to the community and collaborates with North Central Missouri College's Athletic Department to organize a toy drive to benefit local children.

Music Jam

Country music recording artist and "The Voice" semi-finalist, Jordan Rainer, and Trenton High School sophomore, Makayla Mejia, drew a crowd of approximately 340 attendees to the Leadership Northwest Music Jam, which is the largest crowd to date at the event over the last four years. All ticket proceeds benefited the Leadership Northwest Missouri program and raised \$14,475 for the organization.

The show was hosted for the fourth consecutive year at Black Silo Winery in Trenton, MO on Saturday, August 31. Rolli'n Blue BBQ, Mococo Cafe provided food for dinner options, along with Champs Tasty Treats serving specialty lemonade drinks.
